The Learnington Closed Championships are being held on Saturday and Sunday this weekend (25th / 26th February) at Sydenham Sports Centre, Learnington Spa, with the finals night itself on Saturday 18th March. The top seeds for the Mens Singles are Alan Hewitt (2004 winner) and Mark Jackson (defending 2005 champion), followed by Ian Packford and Gary Webb. Earl Sweeney and Jon Williams are defending their Mens Doubles title and are seeded first, with Ian Packford and Mark Jackson the second seed. The top two seeds for the Mixed Doubles are Jon Williams with Jane Dickens and Earl Sweeney partnering Kay Nason. The Youth Singles has Navinder Matharu as top seed, Edward Freeman next. For possibly the first time following a large entry, the Under 11 Singles is seeded, Matthew Outhwaite at one, Lawrence Sweeney two, which could lead to a repeat of last year's final where Matthew beat Lawrence. Similarly Matthew is also second seed in the Under 13 Boys (which he won last time) with last year's runner-up Jack Randle first seed. For the Veteran Men, Gary Webb and Michael Wilkins are seeded one and two, then Earl Sweeney (2005 winner) and Phil Paine. In the Veteran Over 50, Michael Wilkins and Phil Paine are the top contenders and Graham Hoskin and Alf Chapman are similarly placed in the Veteran Over 60. The Graded events are not seeded and are being held on Saturday along with the Junior events. The Mens, Ladies and Veteran events are held on the Sunday. Spectators welcome and refreshments available. Play starts at 10am on both days.

One of the semi-finals for the team-handicapped Southwell Cup, which is played in five games each up to 61 points, will give a Free Church team a path to the final, with Free Church I to play from scratch against Free Church L off +15.
