## Week Commencing 27<sup>th</sup> November 2006

Free Church M continue their dominance of Division C and are surely a safe bet for promotion at Christmas. They notched up another couple of maximum wins - Phil Booth, Daniel Ward and Richard Pittaway crushing Free Church Q and Eathorpe I 5-0. Eathorpe J, with two games in hand, can still catch Church M and kept up their challenge with two convincing 5-0's of their own. William Henry, Paul Deavall and Robert Young showing their class against Free Church L and Free Church P. 'Thorpe J and Church M have still to meet – a match which could decide the title. Rugby's G and H sides faced each other and the G side took a narrow 3-2 win in a match where all participants picked up a single. Michael Brown and Steve Bertie took the mens doubles title at the expense of Ian Packford / Earl Sweeney (Leamington) and the two Leamington players also featured in the final of the mixed; Packford partnering Rachel Pilgrim to success over Sweeney and Tracey Fletcher. Ryan Stockham beat Paul Savins (Leamington) in the Mens Restricted Singles final and

Spencer siblings Luke and Charlotte (Leamington) triumphed in the Under 11 Boys and Girls Restricted events respectively.
